#### Find the key levers of action

- Finance (which is not economics)
  Green bonds over 1 billion USD in the past year based on our criteria
  - Decision making processes adoptions, buy in, ownership CRIDA, World Bank Decision Tree
  - Look actively for policy connections with people who can help translate for you
- #ClimateIsWater campaign, SDGs, UNFCCC, regulators, Sendai, Ramsar, CBD
- Crises: make sure that preparation meets opportunity Case: Do you know what an NDC is? The new language for development, including infrastructure, ecosystems, investment.



### LEARN YOUR AUDIENCE

- There is much you can't take credit for; having other groups take credit for your work is a sign of success
- Be a good party host; convening is a powerful form of credit
- Learn process do the work to learn their system
- Work to become the translator
- Mind the gaps disciplines, institutions, cultures, experiences
- Keep showing up
